ROSTER OF ASTRONOMY DEPARTMENTS WITH ENROLLMENT AND DEGREE DATA, 1997.

This roster contains detailed data from the annual Survey of Enrollments and Degrees. The survey was conducted during the 1997-98 academic year and consists of all degree-granting astronomy departments in the United States. Presented in this roster are the data for the 1996-97 introductory enrollments, 1996-97 degrees and the 1997-98 undergraduate and graduate student enrollments.

There are 69 degree-granting astronomy departments. Of these departments, 33 are combined with the physics department at the same university. The remaining 36 departments are administered separately from the physics department.

The introductory enrollment figures represent the number of students who were taking their first college/university astronomy course at one of the 69 astronomy departments. The undergraduate enrollments only include students at the junior and senior level. Data on total graduate student enrollment, as well as the number of foreign and first year students included in that total, are given for departments that offer graduate degrees.

Notations used in this roster:

- c* Department is combined with the physics department (N=33).
- s* Department is separate from the physics department (N=36).
- m* Department grants a masters as its highest astronomy degree (N=4).
- p* Department grants a PhD as its highest astronomy degree (N=39).
- GRADUATE ONLY Department has no undergraduate program in astronomy (N=8).
- MASTERS** This column includes both masters degrees from masters-granting departments and masters degrees from doctorate departments whose students are leaving that department.
- MASTERS ENROUTE** This column contains masters degrees from doctorate-granting departments for students continuing onto their PhD in the same department.
- Data for this field were not provided.

The totals presented in the following table represent all astronomy departments. This includes data from the responding departments as well as estimated data for the four non-responding departments. All estimates were derived from department responses to the survey in a previous year.
